The Busselton Blazers Representative Program is designed to support and inspire our young basketballers to reach their potential—both on and off the court.

Players who show skill, dedication, enthusiasm and the desire to improve will have the exciting opportunity to represent our Association across a series of regional and state carnivals.

We're here to build skills, friendships, sportsmanship and confidence. Whether you're new to development programs or returning for another season, we can't wait to have you be part of the Blazers family.

Trials

Trials will take place on Saturday 9th and Sunday 10th of August at Geographe Leisure Centre. Each age group will have two trial sessions. Squads of approximately 18–20 players will be selected (up to 30 for U18s).

Once trials are completed, squad selection emails will be sent with further information.

Players must register in their designated age group according to their year of birth. In some cases, younger players may be invited to play up to assist with squad numbers, subject to BABA and Basketball WA approval.

Program Fees

The Blazers Representative Program fee for the 25 –26 season is approximately **\$220.** (Yet to be finalized.)

This cost includes:

- Weekly training court hire
- Team registrations for carnivals
- Officials Travel Allowance
- Referee costs
- End-of-season wind-up, trophies & gifts
- General program operating costs

If selected to participate in the BWA State Championships, there will be an additional fee to cover carnival expenses **\$110** (Yet to be finalized.)

Training Schedule

Weekly training will commence after squad announcements and continue until the final carnival in February. Training days and times depend on court and coach availability. The manager will organize this.

To participate in the Blazers Program, all players must have a domestic team, be registered and fully financial participants in the upcoming BABA season.

Uniforms & Merchandise

All players are required to wear:

- Busselton Blazers warm-up shirts to training and carnivals
- Busselton Blazers socks & shorts to carnivals

These items are compulsory uniform and will be available to purchase through Sportfirst Busselton. Fitting and ordering details will be communicated before the season starts.

Playing shirts are provided at each carnival and are organized by the manager.

Carnivals

Our Blazers squads proudly represent Busselton in the following annual carnivals:

- 1. South West Slammers Regional Carnival October/ November
- Held in various South West towns with all squad members playing.
- 2. Basketball WA State Championships November/December
- One team per age group (possibly two for U18s) selected to play in Perth.
- 3. Basketball WA Country Championships February/ March
- Held in Perth with all squad members playing against the top country teams in WA.

Specific dates and details will be shared on our website as they are confirmed.

Team Selection

For Regional and Country Carnivals two teams will be formed:

Championship Team 1 & Development Team 2

For the State Championships:

- One Championship team will be selected.
- A 2nd U18 team may be nominated if numbers permit.

Selections are at the discretion of the Coaches- based on training, effort, talent, attitude and skill development.

Court Time & Guidelines

We value fairness, effort and growth. Coaches will aim to balance player development with team performance throughout the season.

Please note:

- Ul2s must receive court time in both halves of every game.
- For all other age groups, court time may vary, depending on team strategy and opposition.

We ask families to view court time over the whole season, not individual games.

Coaches & Managers

All Blazers coaches and managers are approved by the BABA Committee and must hold a current Working with Children Check.

Our coaches bring valuable experience, knowledge and enthusiasm to their voluntary roles. Parents are encouraged to support and respect their leadership.

Managers (usually a parent volunteer) will assist with communication, coordination and game-day logistics. They will be the conduit between coaches and parents/players if any issues arise.

Please speak with your manager if you have any concerns during the season, and they will contact BABA as required.

Representative Points

Players earn Representative Points from the previous BABA domestic season.

Those carnivals are:

South West Regional Carnival 0 Points

BWA State Championships 2 Points

BWA Country Championships. 2 Points (Championship Team Only)

Maximum of 2 points will be allocated per player per season.
